Noteworthy Cases Of The Quarter

Yamuna Tambe*, (25,F), lived on the streets in Koparkhairane with her old mother and three young children. She cannot remember how young she was when she was devoured into flesh trade and made it a means to eke out a living.

On the fateful day, one of her customers alleged that she stole his mobile and cash and got her arrested. She was lodged in Kalyan jail and was in custody for 4 months. She was released on PR

bond while cash bail was to be paid to prevent going back to jail.

Global Care Foundation paid for her bail of Rs. 6000 since she's the only breadwinner of the family and has completely left her earlier source of income and now sells vegetables for daily survival.





His mother and wife were overjoyed upon release of Amin. GCF repaired their broken house to which they were overwhelmed.

Amin Shaikh*, (22,M), a resident of a broken shanty of Mankhurd, lived with his handicap mother, wife and two children.

He worked in the Mazgaon docks as a helper and due to abject poverty, got into wrong company of friends who were planning to steal.

On the fateful day, he was arrested by Tilak Nagar Police upon being named by his friend in the theft that was done by him.



Amin is the sole earner of the family and during his stay in the

jail, his mother made ends meet through borrowings.

Global Care Foundation paid for his bail of Rs. 15000 and got him released from Taloja jail.

Noteworthy Cases Of The Quarter

Gargi Kale*, (20,F), abandoned her home in Nashik during the lockdown and came to Mumbai in search of work. A lady, Amruta, in Vashi gave her shelter and became her benefactor.

Amruta and Gargi sell tea outside KEM hospital for survival. One day on their way back home, a fellow commuter's mobile phone fell off their pocket which Gargi picked up to return, but it was construed that she was stealing it and was arrested.



She was lodged in Byculla jail and was there for a week. Since her family didn't have any contact and Amruta too couldn't furnish her bail, Global Care Foundation paid for her bail of Rs. 15000.



Thankfulness towards GCF's efforts to get him released so that he could reunite with his family.

Ayaz Shaikh, (34,M), a begari worker was riding his friend's scooty with his friend and a taxi hit the scooty and damaged it. Both of them got into a fight with the taxi driver and was arrested for fighting and hurting in 2015.

He was let out on bail but being illiterate didn't know about attending the court hearings and missed several hearings. In April 2022 he was arrested on warrant owing to missing of court dates.



He has three little children while his wife takes care of them.

Since they didn't have the means to pay for his bail, Global Care Foundation paid Rs. 15000 and he was released from Taloja jail.

CIRCULAR:

WHEREAS, I, Prasad Palsingankar, Principal Judge, Family Court, Mumbai, in consultation with I/C Principal Marriage Counselor, hereby invoke provisions under section 5 and 12 read with section 9 and 10 of the Family Courts Act and read with section 22 and 23 of Maharashtra Family Court Rules, 1987 as under.

WHEREAS, the emphasis in Family Courts should be settlement of dispute at threshold or at the initial stages of the proceeding with the help of Marriage Counsellors and experts and members of association.

WHEREAS, the scope and reasons of the Family Courts
Act, 1984 was to provide in association of social welfare agencies,
counselors etc. during conciliation stage and also to secure the services
of medical and welfare experts,

WHEREAS, the legislature in it's statement and reason in Family Courts Act, 1984, mentions that it is obligatory on the part of Family Court the first to explore reconciliation or settlement between the parties in the family dispute and in such proceeding shall not follow rigid rules of procedure,

bono basis. It is made clear that the assistance will be preferably on probono basis or as per orders of fees passed by respective Court in particular case.

The Marriage counselors and courts are hereby directed to explore possibility of taking help of any of the following NGO, Government Agencies organizations / Persons to help achieve object of The Family Courts Act 1984 and to help parties to amicably resolve the matrimonial dispute by referring suitable case case to suitable agency.

The circular dated 19.05.2022 stands modified. So far as list is concerned
